## Church FAQs: Worship Activities for Lent

The focus for the Lenten season should be to know God and to have Him in our daily life. There are several activities planned for this Lenten season that will help us hear more clearly what God is saying to us. Services for the Lenten season are being planned by the Worship Committee to grow our prayer life through the Word, through chant and community spirit. The seating in the Sanctuary will be arranged to reflect our desire to have Christ become the center of our worship.

- **First Lenten Soup Supper on Wednesday, March 4<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m.** The discussion will be led by the Sisters of St. John the Baptist of Mendham. There are no pre-requisites other than a desire to share a Lenten journey and break bread with friends.
- **Quiet Day on Saturday, March 28<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. - 4:15 p.m.** Quiet Days may not be for all, but if you seek an opportunity to sit quietly and listen for God's voice, this is a happening waiting for you. (Please refer to the article on page 2 for more details.)
- **First Service of New Light on Easter Eve on Saturday, April 11<sup>th</sup>.** The Easter Vigil service is a celebration of the Resurrection of Christ and what we have prepared for during Lent. Mark this important service on your calendar.

## From the Rector's Desk

At the youth meeting the other night, we had a conversation about rules. They were asked to come up with all the rules they remembered about church, God and religion, and had to select the best one. Sorting through dozens of ideas, they came up with one, but insisted on having a second. After reading aloud some interesting Levitical notions about women's and men's bodily functions, the teens agreed with Jesus about the most important rule – loving God and other people. Happily their first choice was an exact mirror, but they felt the need to include: *Forgiveness is always an option*. You don't have to live too long to need that one and you can't live so long as to do without it. What wasn't clear was whether the teens were asking for it for themselves or claiming that they needed to offer forgiveness to others. Safe bet that it was a kind of get-out-of-jail card. Still, hard to ask for what you cannot give, but most of us do. Perhaps Lent is a time to get that ratio aligned a bit more one to one.
