CHS Pedals for Progress Bicycle Collection

Put your used bike to good use

Sunday, October 12th 1:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m.



Do you have an adult or children's bike in repairable condition that is in need of a new home? Donate it to Pedals for Progress on Sunday, October 12 at the CHS-sponsored bicycle collection. This organization has received, processed and donated over 115,000 bicycles, 1,000 used sewing machines and \$10.8 million in new spare parts to partner charities in 32 developing world countries.

CHS parishioners, youth and adults have been **involved** in this effort for **over 24 years**. **This year's** CHS-sponsored Pedals for Progress used bicycle collection **will be held at Unity Bank on Old Highway 22, rain or shine**. Since it costs \$35 to collect, process, ship, rebuild and distribute each bicycle, a donation toward shipping costs is necessary with a suggested minimum of \$10 per bike.

Volunteers are needed to help with this worthwhile cause from **12:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m.** Students from grades sixth and up can volunteer on their own, while children in grades third through fifth can volunteer if accompanied by a parent. Adult volunteers are also welcome. Posters will be available in the Narthex for posting throughout the community.

From the Rector's Desk

"Talent is overrated and frequently misunderstood," begins John C. Maxwell in his newest management book, *Talent is Never Enough*. He promises to explain all. "I have discovered thirteen key choices that can be made to maximize any person's talent." Hum . . . Why thirteen? Why not fourteen? Thirteen could be twelve or even eleven. The most striking notion is that Maxwell believes he, "discovered," these particular choices. Should PBS's Nova be called? Maybe an IMAX movie should be made of his find. How can I be blamed for sarcasm when encountering another business success recipe book: combine a seventh of a pound of this Habit, one slice of Six Sigma, and a dash of Fifth Level leadership? How can I go from Good to Great when it is so easy to confuse numbers and somebody keeps moving my cheese out where the buffalo roam? If these books really worked, why would anyone write another one? More to the point, if they worked, why would anyone *buy* another one? This skepticism falls into the realm of never trusting a bald miracle worker. **It's funny how human life hasn't changed much over the centuries. In 66 AD, a chronicler of Roman society by the name of Petronius wrote this about his government**

and armies: We trained hard, but it seemed every time we were beginning to form into teams, we would be reorganized. I was to learn later in life that we tend to meet any new situation by reorganizing; and what a wonderful method it can be for creating the illusion of progress while producing confusion and inefficiency.



For almost twenty years, we have been working toward the same mission: **To know Christ as we serve others, proclaim his love and grow in his Spirit. Amen.** Occasionally, we've thought about revisiting it. But a greater wisdom has prevented us. We do not have to adopt the newest advice, or reorganize or wordsmith what is still true for us. We simply have to keep doing that which has been received, and perhaps be more intentional about inviting others to join us, enlarging our abilities to care and serve. There are no twelve point plans the Vestry has to adopt and go about training everybody. There is only God in whom we live and move and have our being. Serveproclaimgrow.

From the Deacon's Corner

Dear Seekers,

I always like to share good news with you after my visits to the local prisons. Recently, we have been showered by a testimony from a woman at the Edna Mahan Correctional Facility. Renee has been incarcerated for 26 years in Maximum Security within the prison and is part of our Shawl Ministry.

Renee works in the Optical Department in the prison and she, along with four other women, work daily to clean, categorize and sort donated eye glasses. On behalf of the Lion's Club, approximately 80,000 to 100,000 pairs per year are sent all over the world. For her work, Renee is paid \$82 per month. With her earnings she has made two monetary donations to be used for the Shawl Ministry. Her first donation was \$15 and her second \$20.

I am humbled beyond words with the following note that was sent to us with her second donation:

Dear Church of the Holy Spirit,

It is such a privilege to be part of God's kingdom. It is a blessing to be able to share God's love with those who are ill. As our Lord continues to provide, let us be eager to give, knowing we cannot out give God. Let us give with joy. I am so excited to be a part of this wonderful Shawl Ministry. Here is a gift and may God continue to bless you all as we press on in Christ's love for us."

TRES DIAS OF NORTHERN NEW JERSEY – Upcoming 2008 Weekend Dates to be held at Emmaus House, Perth Amboy, NJ:

- Next weekend for **MEN** is scheduled for October 23-26, 2008

John Wood will be facilitating a seven-week study on one of the great bible themes, "Knowing God." The course will explore what God said about who He is and how He wants to relate with people in the Bible using all of the text from Genesis to Revelations. A Resource Guide will be provided for each session and we are asking each participant to contribute \$20 for the cost of the program. Sessions began on September 25th and are scheduled from 7:00-9:00 p.m. on Thursday evenings.
