Church FAQs:

May I receive communion more than once a day?

Interesting question. When I was a child attending a "low" Episcopal church in Maryland, Holy Communion was the exception rather than the rule of a Sunday morning. Eucharist was celebrated once a month and the other Sundays were Morning Prayer services. To receive communion more than once a day would have been difficult to do. In just about every Episcopal Church in this country, Holy Communion is celebrated at two to three services every Sunday. For decades, the Roman church permitted you to receive communion only once a day until the 1970's when Rome allowed you to receive twice if you attended Mass and were also present at a Special Mass (wedding, funeral). Even in Rome, this rule has been changed to allow you to receive the body and blood of Christ more often.

Today, the church recognizes that every Sunday is like Easter again, a remembrance that Christ died for us and a celebration of the Resurrection. Every Sunday should again commemorate the Last Supper and the institution of Jesus' command to his disciples: "Take, eat; This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

From the Rector's Desk

For the last 28 years, we have taken in a play at the New Jersey Shakespeare Festival at Drew University. The dramas and romances are always good, but the comedies are especially well done. In all three genres, Shakespeare throws in comic relief in the form of a fool or clownish figure such as Jacques and Touchstone in our favorite: *As You Like It*. The fool is pivotal to the action and narrative as well as playing a necessary emotional role for the audience. The gravedigger in *Hamlet* offers us a chuckle at just the right moment in a long fraught, anxiety laden tale with all the main characters dead by final curtain (blood and gore auteur Quentin Tarantino's got nothing on the Bard). The unrelenting nature of the play is made penetrable by being punctuated with humor, foolishness, and downright belly laughs.



For some, the value of television political comedians John Stewart and Steven Colbert is simply to play the court jester. They can playfully tell any President that he's got no clothes without getting their head lopped off. Our college and high school kids love these two guys because they tell a truth in such a way as few do. They stand outside the courtyard and lob jibe after jibe. The moment they take themselves seriously will be the moment they lose their purpose and power. Was Jesus the ultimate court jester? Was the King of Kings wearing a jester's grin when he told those few parables that enraged the religious establishment? Does the same Prince of Clowns offer the jibe to any with pretense of rightness over and against another? As for our own mission, is there a fool's errand we can properly take up, adding the light touch, the humorous voice in a stalled and stale moment? Humor is perhaps one of the most difficult of all the spiritual gifts, too difficult for St. Paul to mention (who most assuredly lacked the same). Humor is still worth the attempt and exercise and the healing that can erupt in the laugh is not to be ignored. Blessings on all of us Fools for Christ's Sake.

From the Deacon's Corner

Dear Seekers,

Yesterday when I was down at the Cathedral for the Homecoming Day with the clergy of the diocese, I was reminded that on the 21st of September, I will have been ordained a Deacon for seven years. It is hard for me to believe.

As a Vocational Deacon, I attended the School of Deacons for three years of study and performed 400 hours of Clinical Pastoral Education at Toms River Community Medical Center. The Diaconate is a servant ministry.

I have very specific duties that are different than a priest's duties. As a Deacon, I am to assist the priest and the bishop in the Liturgy of the Mass, to lead the people out into the world to serve others in Christ's name, and to interpret the needs and concerns of the world and bring those needs back to the church. I, therefore, gather the people in the outside world. I am truly a bridge between the church and the world.

I read the Gospel, preach once a month, lead prayers, set the table, distribute communion and dismiss the congregation into the world. There are three functions that a priest does that I cannot do and this is absolve sins, bless the people, and consecrate the Blessed Sacrament. I have been truly blessed over these last seven years.
