Church FAQs: *Colors of the Church Year*

As you may have noticed, the colors of the vestments worn by the priests and the altar hangings used in some churches change from time to time throughout the Church year. Each season of the liturgical calendar is associated with a distinct color.

PURPLE: In the Middle Ages, purple dye was very expensive and came to be associated with wealth and royalty. During Advent, we use the color purple with the color rose for the third Sunday to signify joy. Notice the candles in the Advent wreath: three purple, one rose. We celebrate the coming of our King through the use of this color. Blue, which represents the Virgin Mary, is becoming more frequent during this season as well.


Purple is also the color for Lent and is representational of Lent being the time for preparation and penitence. We add different symbols at this time, such as the nails or crown of thorns to give visual separation from Advent when the Alpha-Omega is more appropriate. Notice also that Bishops wear purple shirts rather than the black of most clergy as a symbol of their Apostolic position.

After much prayerful consideration, we have decided to leave our ministry at the Mountain-view Prison Facility for Men for a variety of reasons. The main reason is that attendance has fallen throughout the last several months. We are really sad to say good-bye to this most worthwhile ministry, for it has lasted for five years. If another evening becomes available, we hope to be able to serve again. However, we are hopeful that it can be replaced with a prison ministry at the Hunterdon County Jail. This opportunity at the jail is still in process.

A recent shawl recipient sent a thank you note to the woman who knitted the shawl. Her words encapsulate the mission of the Shawl Ministry. She said, "God has been so gracious during this time and it is so comforting to see how He uses you to wrap His arms around me."

The Confirmation class has grown to eleven youth. There are eight young men and three young women presently taking the class. Each student has a sponsor from the faith community who will accompany them through this long process. It is very exciting for all concerned. Our time together is all about the youth building a relationship with God and his/her sponsor. The Confirmation class will be going to our sister parish, Cristo Rey in Trenton on December 14th for a church service. They will also bake cookies the day before so that we can host the coffee hour for church members on that Sunday. The Confirmation class will also be helping the Church School children make a Christmas gift for one of their parents.

Life is always busy in this faith community. Stay tuned.

Colors of the Church Year

WHITE: White is a celebratory color and hence is used for Christmas, Easter and at Baptisms. White gets a lot of mention in the New Testament to describe angels, the shroud of Jesus, and the Book of Revelation refers often to the color white. It is a color of purity and resurrection and will be seen at funerals, despite the church season. Gold is an alternative to white.

RED: This symbol of blood is used for any service commemorating a martyr; it symbolizes fire and thus is the color of Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit, and of ordinations. As an alternative for Holy Week, deep red often replaces purple because of its interpretative meaning.

GREEN: The most often seen color during the church year is green, used during the entire length of the season after Pentecost which runs until Advent. It is also the color of the season of Epiphany which starts after January 6th and concludes with Ash Wednesday. These two seasons are referred to as Ordinary Time as the Sundays are referenced as 2nd Sunday after Epiphany or the 4th Sunday after Pentecost, as opposed to Christmas or Easter.

BLACK: Less frequently seen is the color black, used for Good Friday, sometimes for funerals.
